eResources

- You can access eResources (“electronic resources”) by clicking on the ‘Research’ link on the Middlesex County Library website at www.library.middlesex.ca.
- eResources are organized by category (Automotive, Careers, For Kids, Health, etc.) or alphabetically.
- The majority of eResources are available for remote use at home. This can be done by entering in your User ID (all of the numbers, without any spaces, on your library card) and PIN password.
- Ancestry Library Edition and Canadian Red Book are accessible for in-library use only.

Academic OneFile

- Academic OneFile is a comprehensive, up-to-date, and easy-to-use resource for academic research. This resource has an extensive coverage of the physical sciences, technology, medicine, social sciences, the arts, theology, literature, and many other subjects.



Career Cruising

- Career Cruising is a guidance resource with career profiles and links to relevant Canadian college and university programs. Other features found in this resource include a Career Matchmaker, Career Portfolio Tool, and a Canadian Job Search and employment section.



CPI.Q

- CPI.Q provides access to Canadian and Canadian-focused journals, magazines, and newspapers. The resource also includes full-text back issues of The Globe and Mail dating back to January 1, 1985.

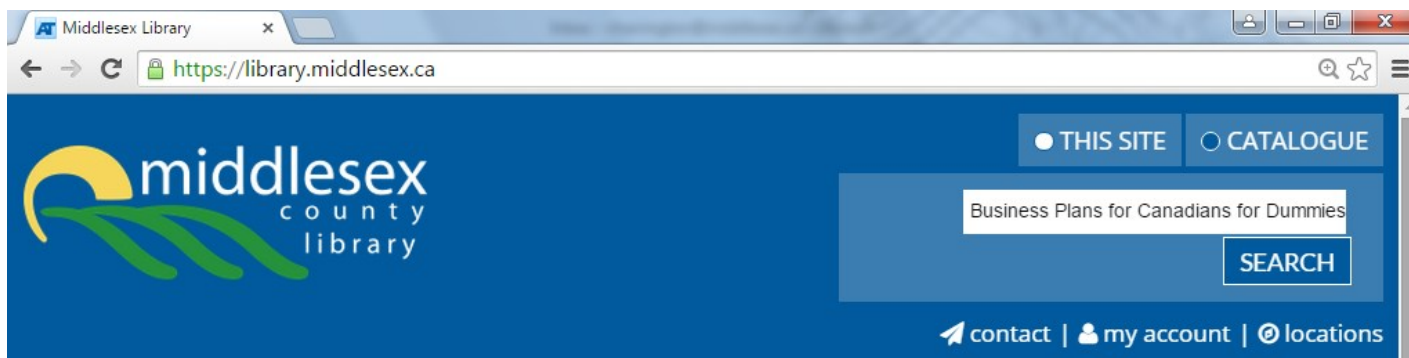
Online Courses
